

2001 PREP INCIDENTS

February 29, 2000 – A train derailment released 20,000 gallons of lube oil. A partial quantity of the oil impacted a small stream near Amsterdam, MO. Haz-Mat Response Inc. provided personnel and equipment to recover the product. Two hundred and fifty (250) feet of boom was deployed (providing chain cells) to protect against migration and to contain the material until complete recovery could be performed. Skimmers, vacuum trucks, oil mops (sub-contract), wash down pumps, absorbents and temporary storage were all employed at the site to recover the spill material.

HMR personnel included B. Waln, K. Simmons, Wm. McMoran, J. Kinney, M. Wall, D. Smith, B. Lurvey, R. Groceman.

April 2001 – KNAEB Drill, El Dorado Reservoir Spillway, HMR Wichita Office personnel deployed three hundred (300) feet of containment boom. Recovery techniques were simulated and discussed. K. Simmons, B. Banz, A. Gremmel, W. King and T. Noland conducted the deployment.

July 2001 – Equilon Pipeline Company... Great Bend, KS... HMR attended a table-top exercise outlining response efforts that would be undertaken at the local storage facility in the event of a spill. B. Becker, K. Simmons and T. McFarren attended the exercise

November 2001 – Haz- Mat Response personnel assisted with a table-top drill conducted by Cargill. The drill discussed containment, recovery and temporary storage situations for the Wichita, KS terminal. K. Simmons and A. Gremmel attended.

December 2001 – Great Bend, KS HMR office conducted a drill at a local sand pit. Four hundred (450) feet of containment boom was deployed (shore to shore). Oil recovery techniques were discussed and simulated. Attending personnel included D. Sommers, S. Jones, T. McFarren, R. Robison, and R. Diebert.

Haz-Mat Response, Inc. owned and dedicated equipment was used during these incidents and drills.
